ABOUT QCF

- Established in 2006
- Mission: Building a *Quality Community for a Lifetime* within the City of Commerce City by:
 - Attracting charitable gifts and promoting community philanthropy
 - Serving as a steward for entrusted funds directed towards programs and activities of economic, educational, social, and cultural nonprofit organizations
 - Enhancing the effectiveness of the nonprofit community
 - Serving as a community resource for individuals, nonprofit agencies, and the community-at-large

SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM

QCF Community Scholarship

Awards \$4,000 over four-years to students pursuing their **first** post-secondary degree.

- Attending a college, university, or vocational school in Colorado
- Resident of Commerce City
- Cumulative High School GPA of 2.0 or greater
- One scholarship is funded by the City Council & awarded as the City Council Scholarship

Curt Holland Police Scholarship

Awards \$8,000 over four-years to CCPD employees or their dependents pursuing their <u>first</u> post-secondary degree.

- May reside anywhere
- Must be CCPD employee or dependent of CCPD employee
- May attend college, university, or vocational school in any location

QCF NONPROFIT GRANT PROGRAMS

- Grant activities must benefit Commerce City residents
- Awardees must be a nonprofit organization with proof of 501(c)3 status and in good standing with State and Federal regulations
- Two types of grants
 - Project/Program Grants Awards up to \$7,500
 - General Operating Support (GOS) Grants Awards up to \$5,000





2023 QCF NONPROFIT GRANTS

- Awarded 30 grants to nonprofits benefitting the Commerce City community
 - 25 Program/Project Grants ranging from \$1,000 to \$7,500
 - 5 General Operating Support (GOS) Grants of \$5,000

RECREATION SCHOLARSHIP CRITERIA

- Established in 2014
- Administered by PRG
- Awarded based on income qualification criteria and funds recreation programs for all ages
- Recipients receive up to 50% off classes
- Individuals must reside in Commerce City
- Granted all year as-needed





2023 GOALS

- 1. Increase marketing efforts to better tell the story of the QCF to recruit 3 new members.
 - Two new members joined in Q1
- 2. Meet with 2 new City departments or external partners to develop new relationships.
 - Partnered on 80s Prom with PRG in Q2
 - Met with Commerce City Leadership & Rotary Club
- 3. Raise \$2,500 for Recreation Scholarships, \$2,500 for General Operating Funds and \$90,000 for Post-Secondary Education Scholarships.
 - 2023 Fundraisers have included 80s Prom and Community Nights at Commerce City restaurants





80S PROM

- Partnered with PRG for new fundraising effort
- QCF hosted a silent auction and sold 3 sponsorship tables to local organizations
- Raised over \$4,000!
