Memorial Day Parade Entry Form Now Open

One of Commerce City's favorite traditions is back in the heart of the city on Monday, May 29, and we are currently seeking entries for the 57th Annual Memorial Day Parade! CCPD Introduces Online Crime Reporting Form

The Commerce City Police Department has a new online reporting tool allowing the public to report some non-emergency crimes and receive a police report immediately without having to speak to a police officer. Community members can now conveniently report incidents that do not require immediate officer intervention, such as fraud, identity theft, lost property, theft/shoplifting (less than \$2,000), and vandalism.

The new form is online now in English and Spanish at c3gov.com/ReportACrime.

Residents should always call 911 for emergencies, and continue to use the non-emergency dispatch line (303-288-1535) for crimes that do not fit the criteria for online reporting.

Second Creek Trail Closure

A section of the Second Creek Trail is closed for tunneling work between E. 104th Avenue and E. 106th Way through May 31. Installation work on the Second Creek Pipeline (being constructed by Metro Water Recovery) is expected to be complete by early May, with restoration of the area completed by end of May. Staff hopes the restoration matures enough in June and July to be ready for the PRG Tour de Donut

Executive Summary

This update is intended to provide a weekly update of environmental policy and planning work including, but not limited to:

- Environmental Policy Advisory Committee (EPAC), Lotus Contract and Community Outreach
- Municipal Sustainability
- Updates on information regarding the Suncor Refinery and its operations
- Legislative Updates & Regional Environmental Leadership
- Colorado Oil and Gas Conservation Commission (COGCC) Regulations & Applications

Environmental Policy Advisory Committee (EPAC) and Community Outreach

The four-hour bilingual workshop on March 31 regarding re-envisioning Commerce City as a healthier community for residents was well attended. House Representative Dafna Michaelson Jenet spoke briefly and we discussed some of Commerce City's challenges and grant proposals. Citizens were concerned about the increase of alarms since the December shutdown of Suncor. Several reporters from Denver and Colorado Public Radio attended the event. I presented the top thirty EPAC recommendations and answered numerous scientific and legal issues about emissions. The community members expressed an interest in sustainability training about biodiversity, tree canopy, electrification and bioremediation and workforce development in efficiency and renewable energy programs.

Lotus Engineering & Sustainability Contract Progress

Lotus has almost completed the municipal GHG inventory. Vehicle fleet information still needs to be uploaded and analyzed. The Low Impact Development Guidance document will be completed in April after incorporating the third round of feedback from staff. Lotus designed a poster of the sustainability targets to raise awareness internally and externally.



Municipal Sustainability

Dr. Russo has been working with the City and County of Denver on preparing the EPA Environmental Justice Government to Government (EJGTG) grant submittal that is due April 14th. The proposal centers on the Healthy Homes Program, which provides cooling to protect from extreme heat and protection from wildfire smoke, as well as reducing exposure to indoor air pollution and eliminating fossil fuel use. The Healthy Homes Program could get a resilience bonus point because it provides cooling to address extreme heat and provides filtered air to protect from wildfire smoke, in addition to reducing indoor air pollution. Partners include Energy Outreach Colorado, Commerce City and a few non-profits including Cultivando. Denver will be the lead applicant. EOC is the CBO partner, and we would love to see if Commerce City could also be a partner. Commerce City is requesting a full time engagement trainer for three years.

Additional information was provided to PW in regards to the Wemberg contract regarding product, project and policy language. Attachment A and B provides a listing of product labels for numerous types of products such as appliances and electronics and specifications for roof replacements and PV ready structures.

Dr. Russo has contacted several colleagues at DU to try and obtain speakers for the Juneteenth celebration.

Suncor Refinery

The refinery had 13 exceedances in the latest reporting period. Two of those exceedances triggered EPCRA notification requirements. EPCRA indicates a significant emission leak above 500 lbs. of a chemical within a 24 hr. period. Suncor released 500 lbs. of sulfur dioxide twice.

Legislative Updates & Regional and State Environmental Protection Leadership

The state has selected Commerce City as the recipient for the Small Business Equity Fund, an energy efficiency program. Businesses with less than 50 employees are classified as small. Businesses that participate are eligible for FREE replacements:

Exterior / interior lighting with LEDs Case
Cooler lighting with LEDs
Walk-in cooler motors with new ECMs (electronically commutated motors)
Manual thermostats with programmable ones
Light switches with occupancy sensors

Projects eligible for 70% reimbursement include commercial refrigerators, freezers, and merchandisers.



Oil & Gas Updates

Staff is working other municipalities regarding the Hansen bill SB23- 016 and potential implications for Commerce City such as loss of pore space and authority for piping siting within city limits. The bill proposes to broaden COGCC regulatory authority to include the regulation of carbon capture and storage; certain geothermal resource operations and interstate underground natural gas storage facilities. 39 local governments including Commerce City have requested health studies be included as companion legislation and additional legislative provisions added to provide clarity for property owners and local governments since dual siting authority has been established through SB 19-181.
