- Jeanie Nuances King: Artist, Graphic Designer, Commercial Artist – Founder of Santa Fe Art District
 - Concept Colorado, Founder
 - Located on an eleven-acre lot at 6601 Colorado Boulevard.
 - Meet the space at Concept Colorado on September 30th from 4 PM to 9 PM
 - A 53-foot semi-truck that has been transformed into a pop up gallery
 - Members are invited and are asked to forward invitation to anyone.
 - Not losing who Commerce City is with the construction; leaving the barn on site.
 - Jeanie – Wants to focus on public art pieces.
 - Ideas to bring to Commerce City: “Painted Pigs” Parade: Fiberglass pigs for artist to paint and put around Commerce City. History of Commerce City – Hogs farm. Tin foil flowers around the city, to remind people that art can be anywhere. Possible auction off (initial ideas). More than welcome for out of the box ideas, connection, etc.

- Paradise Island at Pioneer Park
PO Box 1021, Commerce City, CO 80022



Funding coming from Paradise Island construction funds. Art work located on 60th, connecting the neighborhood and the park. 200 ft linear display of blowing Kites. Will plan a dedication ceremony, Daniela will help with coordination -> date not set. Artist: Michael Klapp

- Recreation Center on 112th Ave
Fact sheet to be shared at the next meeting (October). Should be able to get sculpture leading up to the Rec Center. Art around the service area. Very visible on Hwy 2. Enough in the budget to have a ceiling hung sculpture. Will present further in October's meeting. 72 applications to narrow down. Public Art Program committee to meet next week. Semi-final list for next week. May present to CCCC in November or December.
- Turnberry Park
Project plan: Background – August 25th, and established plans for the project
Project budget: 1% of art from construction, always set aside 10% for administrative. The rest to go to art. ~ 15K. Committee to do a direct purchase; look at sculptures already available to purchase due to small budget. Searching for art. Theme is "Very Hunger Caterpillar"
Placement of Art – Preferred closest to the school
All Colorado based artist
Goal is to submit recommendation to the Council in November.
- Villages at Buffalo Run East Park
Theme is "Rocky Mountains" – connecting wildlife to the park

 - Time: 5 PM to 6:30 PM
 - Bryan to draft an invitation email to go out to both 27J and Brian will invite Adams 14.
 - Need Tentative YES from schools wanting to participate by Monday October 10th.
 - Limitation: 2D art, no 3D
- BUDGET Tentative
 - \$700 for food– anticipate 250 people
 - \$500 for prizes/marketing/other costs
 - Budget: \$700 for display. Racks are needed. Must spend the \$700.
