PRG - Youth Sport Programs

Purpose of Youth Sports

To provide a safe, fun and positive experience for each participant. Our youth athletic programs are recreational with an emphasis on teamwork, sportsmanship and inspiring an active lifestyle.



Goals

- To give every child the opportunity to participate, regardless of ability
- To teach participants skills and fundamentals of the sport in which they are participating
- To encourage the development of sportsmanship, team play and leadership
- Develop skills, have fun, equal playing time!

PRG - Youth Sport Offerings

Basketball (Winter)

- Age: K – 6th grade, boys & girls
- Participants: 265 kids / 27 teams



Soccer (Spring)

- Age: K – 5th grade, boys & girls
- Participants: 150 kids / 13 teams



PRG - Youth Sport Offerings

Volleyball (Spring & Fall Programs)

- Age: 8 – 14, boys & girls
- Participants: 65 kids /6 teams



PRG - Youth Sport Offerings

Baseball (Summer)

- Age: 5 – 14, boys & girls
- Participants: 432 kids /33 teams



Flag Football (Fall)

- Age: K – 3rd grade, boys & girls
- Participants: 80 kids / 7 teams

- **Coaches/Officials** – Certifications, Clinics & Trainings
- **Skills Challenge** – Denver Nuggets Skills Challenge & Colorado Rockies Skills Challenge

- **Youth Baseball Day** – over 1500 people in attendance
- **CPRA/CARA** – Member, we do several adult and youth sport CARA programs

Coaches

- Required to attend pre-season coaches' meeting & complete coach's training program
- Responsible for upholding Coaches' Code of Ethics
- Responsible for being aware of Parents' Code of Ethics
- National background check required

Youth Sport Providers (YSP)

Guidelines for Recognized Youth Sport Providers (YSP)

- Guidelines for being “recognized” youth sport provider:
 - Program must be open to all Commerce City youth
 - 70% of participants must reside in Commerce City
 - Organization must complete background checks
 - Organization must provide insurance
- City’s role:
 - Help provide fields for practices and games
 - Help promote programs
- Help serve as feeder programs into high school athletics and/or competitive programs

CCYA (Commerce City Youth Athletics)

Tackle Football

- Ages: 6 – 14 years, boys & girls
- Participants: 150 kids / 7 teams



Girls Softball

- Ages: 6 – 14 years, girls
- Participants: 70+ kids / 6 teams



Cheerleading

- Ages: 7 – 12 years, boys & girls
- Participants: 45 kids / 1 team



Recognized Youth Sport Providers (YSP)

Adams City Wrestling Club

- Ages: 4 – 14 years, boys & girls
- Participants: 70+ / 1 team



Brighton Youth Baseball Assoc. (Comp Program)

- Ages 7-14 years, boys & girls
- Participants: 375

Bison Lacrosse Club

- Ages 8 – 15 years, boys & girls
- Participants – 50/3 teams



Rocky Mtn. Thunder Hawks Youth Tackle Football

- Ages 6 – 14 years, boys & girls

Competitive Programs

Competitive Programs

- Typically involve tryouts, multiple practices per week, higher fee & travel
- Typically span geographic boundaries; the more competitive the program, the greater the footprint
- Our role:
 - Recognize provider(s)/association(s)
 - Help provide facilities
- Example: competitive baseball
 - Little League Baseball
 - Brighton Baseball
 - CCYA Baseball

** Our neighboring municipalities do not offer competitive programs through their Parks & Recreation Departments*



Section 4:

Commerce City Youth Sport Facilities

PRG Fields/Parks

- **Pioneer Park:** 4 baseball fields (game fields with limited practices)
- **Fairfax Park:** 3 baseball fields (game/practice fields)
- **Municipal Services Center:** 2 multi-purpose fields (game fields with limited practices)
- **Recreation Center:** 3 basketball courts, gymnastics room
- **Other parks in the community**

Community - Sport Facilities

- **Dicks Sporting Goods Park** – Commerce City Supplemental Youth Program
- **Belle Creek Family Center:** 1 multi-purpose field (for games and practices)
- **School District 14 & School District 27J**
 - IGA exists between the city & both school districts
 - Elementary & middle school gyms & fields used as practice facilities
- **Reunion** has fields, but we don't utilize them for our youth programs

Age: 2 – 18 years, Girls & Boys

- Participants: 539 per session
- (6 sessions per year)
- 2017 - 20 classes per session
- 2019 - **63 classes** per session



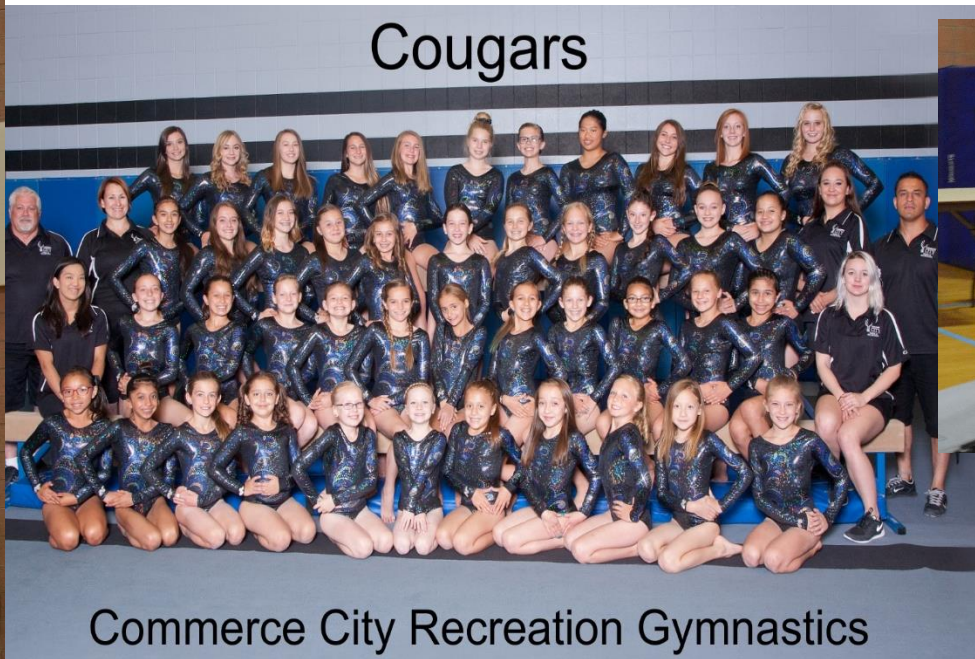
New Gymnastics Gym at Bison Ridge

PRG - Adult Sport Offerings

Basketball (Men's League) Winter

- Age: 16 & Over
- Participants: Offered – League did not go

Volleyball (Coed League) Winter

- Age: 16 & Over,
- 6 Teams / 60 participants

Softball (Men's & Coed Programs) Summer & Fall

- Age: 16 & over
- Summer : 12–18 teams 180 participants
- Fall: 12–18 teams 180 participants

Drop-in Programs

- **Pickleball** – Bison Ridge Rec Center
 - Tues/Thurs/Sun Mornings
- **Basketball** – Both Centers
 - Tues/Thurs/other times
- **Volleyball** - Both centers
 - Bison Ridge – Wed 7:30pm – 9:30pm
 - Eagle Pointe - ???
