1) PARTIES

This Amendment (the "Amendment") to the Original Agreement shown on the Signature and Cover Page for this Amendment (the "Agreement") is entered into by and between the Local Agency and the State.

2) TERMINOLOGY

Except as specifically modified by this Amendment, all terms used in this Amendment that are defined in the Agreement shall be construed and interpreted in accordance with the Agreement.

3) EFFECTIVE DATE AND ENFORCEABILITY

A. Amendment Effective Date

This Amendment shall not be valid or enforceable until the Amendment Effective Date shown on the Signature and Cover Page for this Amendment. The State shall not be bound by any provision of this Amendment before that Amendment Effective Date, and shall have no obligation to pay the Local Agency for any Work performed or expense incurred under this Amendment either before or after the Amendment term shown in §3.B of this Amendment

B. Amendment Term

The Parties' respective performances under this Amendment and the changes to the Agreement contained herein shall commence on the Amendment Effective Date shown on the Signature and Cover Page for this Amendment and shall terminate on the termination of the Agreement.

4) PURPOSE

The parties entered into an agreement on May 17, 2021, for the widening of 88th Avenue in Commerce City, Colorado. Now the parties wish to amend the Original Agreement's SOW, Funding Provisions, and Local Agency Contract Administration Checklist.

5) MODIFICATIONS

- a) The total budgeted funds are increased from \$4,000,000.00 by \$4,800,000.00 to a new total budgeted funds of \$8,800,000.00. The new funding breakdown is as follows:
- i. \$4,000,000.00 is from a federal STBG award of \$4,000,000.00. This award is federal funds of \$3,000,000.00 and Local Agency funds of \$1,000,000.00
- ii. \$1,800,000.00 is from a new federal TAP award of \$1,800,000.00. This award is federal funds of \$1,440,000.00 and Local Agency funds of \$360,000.00
- iii. \$3,000,000.00 is from a new State MMO award of \$4,800,000.00. This award is State funds of \$2,400,000.00 and Local Agency funds of \$600,000.00 + TAP Award noted in ii., above; and
- b) Exhibit C-2 shall be replaced by Exhibit C-3. Any reference in the Original Agreement to Exhibit C, Exhibit C-1, or Exhibit C-2 shall be a reference to Exhibit C-3.
- c) Exhibit A shall be replaced by Exhibit A-1. Any reference in the Original Agreement to Exhibit A shall be a reference to Exhibit A-1.
- d) Exhibit E shall be replaced by Exhibit E-1. Any reference in the Original Agreement to Exhibit E shall be a reference to Exhibit E-1.

6) LIMITS OF EFFECT

This Amendment is incorporated by reference into the Agreement, and the Agreement and all prior amendments or other modifications to the Agreement, if any, remain in full force and effect except as specifically modified in this Amendment. Except for the Special Provisions contained in the Agreement, in the event of any conflict, inconsistency, variance, or contradiction between the provisions of this Amendment and any of the provisions of the Agreement or any prior modification to the Agreement, the provisions of this Amendment shall in all respects supersede, govern, and control. The provisions of this Amendment shall only supersede, govern, and control over the Special Provisions contained in the Agreement to the extent that this Amendment specifically modifies those Special Provisions.

SCOPE OF WORK

Name of Project: E. 88th Ave Multimodal Improvements Construction

Construction of the multimodal components of the E. 88th Ave Widening Project—the sidewalk and multiuse path—with subgrade, grading, lighting, crosswalks, and bridge crossing elements of the sidewalk and multiuse path—and a signalized intersection at Rosemary Street.

This project will complete the following scope and specific elements along E. 88th Avenue:

- Widen 88th Avenue from 2 lanes to 4 lanes west of Rosemary Street and from 2 lanes to 3 lanes east of Rosemary Street with appropriate turn lanes and median.
- Replace an aging bridge over the O'Brian Canal.
- Upgrade the traffic signal at the intersection of 88th Avenue with Rosemary Street and interconnect/coordinate all signals between I-76 (both sets of ramps) and Highway 2.
- Construct sidewalks on one side of the road and a multiuse trail on the other to accommodate bikes and pedestrians as recommended in the City's adopted" Walk.Bike.Fit" Plan.
- Implement the 60-inch storm sewer planned by Mile High Flood District (MHFD) for the Irondale Outfall Systems Plan Conceptual Design Report dated September 2011.

If ARPA funds are used, all ARPA funds must be encumbered by December 31, 2024. All work funded by ARPA must be completed by December 31, 2026 and all bills must be submitted to CDOT for payment by January 31, 2027. These bills must be paid by CDOT by March 31, 2027.

By accepting funds for this Scope of Work, Local Agency acknowledges, understands, and accepts the continuing responsibility for the safety of the traveling public after initial acceptance of the project. Local Agency is responsible for maintaining and operating the scope of work described in this Exhibit A constructed under this Agreement at its own cost and expense during its useful life.

Any work performed before these three (3) milestones are achieved will not be reimbursable.

B. Funding Ratios

The funding ratio for the federal & State funds for this Work is 78% federal & State funds to 22% Local Agency funds, and this ratio applies only to the \$8,800,000.00 that is eligible for federal & State funding. All other costs are borne by the Local Agency at 100%. If the total cost of performance of the Work exceeds \$8,800,000.00, and additional federal & State funds are not available, the Local Agency shall pay all such excess costs. If the total cost of performance of the Work is less than \$8,800,000.00, then the amounts of Local Agency and federal & State funds will be decreased in accordance with the funding ratio described in A1. This applies to the entire scope of Work.

C. Maximum Amount Payable

The maximum amount payable to the Local Agency under this Agreement shall be \$5,715,000.00 (federal & State funds of \$6,840,000.00 minus federal share of ROW of \$1,125,000.00). For CDOT accounting purposes, the federal funds of \$3,315,000.00, the State funds of \$2,400,000.00 and the Local Agency funds of \$985,000.00 (Local Agency funds of \$1,360,000.00 minus Local Agency share of ROW of \$375,000.00) will be encumbered, but the Local Agency funds of \$600,000.00 will not be encumbered for a total encumbrance of \$6,700,000.00, unless this amount is increased by an executed amendment before any increased cost is incurred. The total budget of this project is \$8,800,000.00, unless this amount is increased by an executed amendment before any increased cost is incurred. The total cost of the Work is the best estimate available, based on the design data as approved at the time of execution of this Agreement, and any cost is subject to revisions agreed to by the parties prior to bid and award. The maximum amount payable will be reduced without amendment when the actual amount of the Local Agency's awarded Agreement is less than the budgeted total of the federal funds and the Local Agency funds. The maximum amount payable will be reduced through the execution of an Option Letter as described in Section 7. E. of this contract. **This applies to the entire scope of Work.**

D. Single Audit Act Amendment

All state and local government and non-profit organizations receiving \$750,000 or more from all funding sources defined as federal financial assistance for Single Audit Act Amendment purposes shall comply with the audit requirements of 2 CFR part 200, subpart F (Audit Requirements) see also, 49 CFR 18.20 through 18.26. The Single Audit Act Amendment requirements applicable to the Local Agency receiving federal funds are as follows:

i. Expenditure less than \$750,000

If the Local Agency expends less than \$750,000 in Federal funds (all federal sources, not just Highway funds) in its fiscal year then this requirement does not apply.

^{**} For MMO State Funds, the Local Agency should not begin work until both of the following are in place: 1) the execution of the document encumbering funds for the respective phase; and 2) Local Agency receipt of the official Notice to Proceed. Any work performed these two (2) milestones are achieved will not be reimbursable.

ii. Expenditure of \$750,000 or more-Highway Funds Only

If the Local Agency expends \$750,000 or more, in Federal funds, but only received federal Highway funds (Catalog of Federal Domestic Assistance, CFDA 20.205) then a program specific audit shall be performed. This audit will examine the "financial" procedures and processes for this program area.

iii. Expenditure of \$750,000 or more-Multiple Funding Sources

If the Local Agency expends \$750,000 or more in Federal funds, and the Federal funds are from multiple sources (FTA, HUD, NPS, etc.) then the Single Audit Act applies, which is an audit on the entire organization/entity.

iv. Independent CPA

Single Audit shall only be conducted by an independent CPA, not by an auditor on staff. An audit is an allowable direct or indirect cost.
