A motion was made by Councilmember Madera, seconded by Councilmember Dukes, to draft a letter from Mayor and Council to Colorado Department Transportation to prioritize the roadways in poor condition in Commerce City. VOTE: 9 - Aye

A motion was made by Councilmember Madera, seconded by Councilmember Kim, to direct staff to reach out to the public speaker from Public Comment to potentially partner with the school and plant more trees. VOTE: 9 - Aye

A motion was made by Councilmember Dukes, seconded by , to direct the City Attorney to provide a legal memorandum on the potential change to city code sec. 7-1004 to make park closures start at dusk or 9pm instead of 11pm. Councilmember Ford offered a friendly amendment to forego dusk due to daylight saving time in the winter. VOTE: 9 - Aye
