RESOLUTION AMENDING RESOLUTION 2020-77 TO MODIFY THE MEMBERSHIP OF THE COMMERCE CITY DIVERSITY, EQUITY AND INCLUSION COMMISSION

WHEREAS, the City of Commerce City ("City") previously established the Commerce City Diversity, Equity and Inclusion Commission, via Resolution 2020-77 and Resolution 2021-32, in recognition of the importance of diversity (the range of human differences) and inclusion (putting diversity into action) in City operations and programming and to enhance in the City an environment of involvement, acceptance, respect, appreciation, and connection of all persons;

WHEREAS, the City Council desires to provide for the participation by and membership of members of the City Council on the Commerce City Diversity, Equity and Inclusion Commission;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF COMMERCE CITY, COLORADO, AS FOLLOWS:

- 1. <u>Amendment to Resolution 2020-77</u>. Section 3 of Resolution 2020-77 is repealed and replaced with the following:
 - 3. Membership. The commission will be comprised of up to 13 members, including: (a) up to 11 members appointed from the general public, who shall not be City employees, Council members or their immediate family members, or other elected officials; and (b) up to 2 members who are Council members, with an additional 1 Council member appointed to serve as an alternate. Members shall be, to the extent possible, from diverse economic groups, age groups, genders, nationalities, and city wards. Members, other than Council members, will serve a three-year term and shall serve without compensation. Each member, other than Council members, shall be a resident of the City, an employee of a business in the City, or an owner of property in the City.
- 2. <u>Limited Repeal</u>. Resolution 2020-77 and 2021-32 are repealed by this resolution to the extent of any inconsistency with this resolution. Nothing in this resolution shall invalidate any prior action of or appointment to the Commerce City Diversity, Equity and Inclusion Commission.
