ABOUT QCF

- Established in 2006
- Mission: Building a *Quality Community for a Lifetime* within the City of Commerce City by:
 - Attracting charitable gifts and promoting community philanthropy
 - Serving as a steward for entrusted funds directed towards programs and activities of economic, educational, social, and cultural nonprofit organizations
 - Enhancing the effectiveness of the non-profit community
 - Serving as a community resource for individuals, non-profit agencies, and the community-at-large





PROGRAMS

- Curt Holland Memorial Scholarship Program:
 - Curt Holland Community Scholarship
 - Curt Holland Police Scholarship
- Recreation Scholarships
- Award Grants to local non-profits that serve Commerce City Residents





CURT HOLLAND COMMUNITY SCHOLARSHIP CRITERIA

Each recipient receives up to \$4,000 over a four-year period.

CRITERIA

- Applicants should be pursuing their first degree and are required to attend a college, university or vocational school in Colorado.
- All applicants must be residents of Commerce City.
- City Council, City employees, QCF Board Members and their relatives **are not** eligible to apply.
- New in 2022: One scholarship funded by City Council and awarded as the City Council Scholarship.





CURT HOLLAND POLICE SCHOLARSHIP CRITERIA

Each recipient receives up to \$8,000 over a four-year period.

CRITERIA

- Applicants should be pursuing their first degree and are **required** to attend or plan on attending a college, university or vocational school.
- Applicants may reside anywhere.
- Applicant must be child/minor dependent of current CCPD employee or child/dependent of a line-of-duty fallen officer.
- New in 2023: CCPD officers looking to finish their degrees will be eligible to apply for the scholarship.

RECREATION SCHOLARSHIP CRITERIA

- Grants are administered by PRG awards based on income qualification criteria
- Established in 2014
- Funds recreation programs for all ages
- Recipients receive up to 50% off classes
- Individuals must reside in Commerce City
- Recreation Scholarships granted all year as-needed





NON-PROFIT PROGRAM GRANTS

- Grant activities must benefit Commerce City residents
- Funds must be used for direct programming
- Maximum award amount \$7,500
- Must be a non-profit organization with proof of 501©3 status and in good standing with State and Federal regulations.
- Grant reports for prior year's award are due before any future funding consideration.





NON-PROFIT OPERATING GRANTS

- Maximum grant award: \$5,000
- Eligibility:
 - Prior recipient of QCF Program Grant
 - Successfully completed the scope of work defined in the prior grant application(s)
 - Expended all prior grant funds and submitted all grant reports
- Applicant organizations must be a 501(c)3 non-profit in good standing with State and Federal regulations
