Subject: SUPPLEMENTAL INFORMATION - GRANT WRITING CONTRACT

**AMENDMENTS** 

**Date:** NOV. 21, 2024

The city currently has existing contracts with three grant writing firms, all of which expire at the end of 2024. Staff recommends amending these three contracts to extend the terms to 12/31/2026 and increase the not-to-exceed amounts.

The proposed amendments would:

- Enable the city to meet the federal ARPA funding obligation deadline of 12/31/2024, by fully showing the \$1 million allocated to the 3-year grant writing program as contractually obligated. This obligation deadline is important to minimize risk of having to return un-obligated funds to the federal government after 2024.
- Set staff up to successfully manage these contracts and fully expend the \$1 million in grant writing funding by the federal ARPA funding expenditure deadline of 12/31/2026.

The following provides supplemental information on each of the three (3) grant writing firms that were selected via a Request for Proposals (RFP) and contracting process in the Fall 2023.

# A. FHU (Infrastructure & Transportation Grants)

Prior Grant Writing Experience

- In the last five years, FHU has participated in 40 successful grant applications totaling approx. \$200M in grant awards.
- Types of applications completed for clients: RAISE, PROTECT, SMART, RCN, MPDG, BIP, HSIP, CRISI, BUILD, TIGER, CDOT - RMS, DRCOG Transportation Improvement Program (TIP), DRCOG Regional Transportation Operations & Technology (TSIP)
- Prior Commerce City Grant Support:
  - Wrote successful City of Commerce City Consolidated Rail Infrastructure and Safety Improvements (CRISI) Planning Grant Application for US 85/120<sup>th</sup> Avenue Project for approx. \$10M. in 2023
  - Supported the obligation of federal funds from the CRISI Grant, including grant agreement, scope/schedule/budget, performance measures, terms and conditions, and identifying NEPA requirements.
  - As a result of these efforts, agreement has been executed and project work has begun.

## **Noteworthy Items for 2025 Grant Efforts**

## 1. Lobbyist Support

The Grants Office has engaged with the city's state and federal lobbyists to better position pending and upcoming grant applications.

### 2. Anticipated Increase in ARPA Expenditures

As a result of the Grants Office having been established for over a year, it is anticipated that grant writing expenditures will increase in 2025. 2024 expenditures have been lower due to ramp up time required to complete the RFP process, finalize contracts and on-board each of the grant writing firms. Expenditures have continued to increase in recent months and will continue to increase. We are on track to spend the remaining funds before the ARPA deadline of 12/31/2026. With approval of the proposed contract amendments, application activity will seamlessly continue into 2025 without a gap in services.
