## Business/Economic Development



#### **Business Attraction**

- Staff confirmed that the team planning to open a new concept in the former Dairy Queen building on E. 104<sup>th</sup> Avenue is finalizing construction documents and elevation design for the 3,200 square foot building. The franchisee hopes to submit their plans for review in the next few weeks.
- Staff requested a meeting with the Director of Operations for a fast casual restaurant concept to discuss the possibility of a corporate-operated location in Commerce City.
- Staff connected with the builder for a sushi restaurant and learned the tenant finishes are nearing completion. They hope to have a building inspection in the next 30-60 days and receive a Certificate of Occupancy. Once complete, the restaurant owner will be able to move into the space.
- Staff met with the restaurant owner working on developing a new restaurant concept on E. 120<sup>th</sup> Avenue. The owner confirmed they are still reviewing the proposed letter of intent and working on their business plan for the new restaurant.

#### **Business Attraction – Continued**

- Staff requested a meeting with the broker of a 24-hour diner concept considering a location in the northern range of Commerce City.
- Staff confirmed with the general manager of the auto parts store at 104<sup>th</sup> & Tower that they are in the final stages of the inspections and have a revised targeted opening timeframe of early October.

#### **Business Retention**

- Staff is working with a business in the Colorado Logistics Park to address outdoor storage needs to support its business operations. Access to outside storage is necessary for them to operate at their facility.

#### New staff member announcement

- The Economic Development Division is pleased to welcome Stewart Meek to the team! In his new role as Economic Development Local Business Manager, he will be a dedicated point of contact for developers and business owners to facilitate and provide concierge services throughout the development permit process for economic development projects. Stewart will also build and maintain a successful business retention and expansion program.

In 2021, he was recognized with the "Statesman of the Year" award from the Economic Development Council of Colorado (EDCC). ### Infrastructure

#### **PW Updates**

- Staff participated in CDOT's community outreach planning session for the I-270 interim bridge improvements in order to effectively notify the public about the project. The project involves improvements to the bridges along the corridor to extend the life until the bridges can be replaced. The project is planned to begin Sept. 29 and be complete by the end of December. Work will take place at night on the weekdays and weekends. One lane of traffic will be closed during working hours, causing delays to traffic. Staff is working with local businesses so they can plan accordingly. CDOT and the city will be coordinating to notify the public about the project.
- Staff scheduled a Study Session for Oct. 3 with representatives from the Union Pacific Railroad and Burlington Northern Santa Fe Railway. The study session item was scheduled at the request of City Council.
- Bids were received for the second phase of the citywide roadway crack repair program on Sept. 6.
   Once the contract is approved, work is planned to begin in October.

#### **Parks**

 Staff performed weed maintenance and general trail repairs along the Sand Creek Trail.

#### **Streets**

- Last month's Free Landfill Day at Republic Services Tower Landfill resulted in 464 total loads brought to the landfill, 1,877 yards of debris, and 13 mattresses were processed.
- Staff conducted drain cleaning work at Los Valientes Park, Olive Park, and Freedom Park to address issues resulting from the unusually heavy rains.
- Staff repaired numerous potholes reported through the SeeClickFix system.
- On Tower Road north of E-470, and along E. 60th Avenue west of Highway 85, staff conducted shoulder repairs and repaired damaged asphalt.
- There were no new MYC3 trailer rentals.
