Public Outreach

Meeting Format and Participation

- Turnberry Meeting: April 8
 - Presentation by staff
 - Ballots to select theme and one special feature
 - 10 attendees
 - Online participation: 272 ballots received
 - Total physical ballots received: 79
 - Total ballots: 351



Meeting Format and Participation

- Villages at Buffalo Run East Meeting: April 9
 - Presentation by staff
 - Ballots to select theme and one special feature
 - 18 attendees
 - Online participation: 219 ballots received
 - Total physical ballots received: 55
 - Total ballots: 274



Increase in Public Participation

- Fronterra
 - Meeting 1: 15 attendees; 4 online participants
 - Meeting 2: 15 attendees; 14 online participants
 - Meeting 3: 15 attendees
- Turnberry
 - 10 Meeting attendees; 351 total ballots (79 physical & 272 online)
- Villages at Buffalo Run East
 - 18 Meeting attendees; 274 total ballots (55 physical & 219 online)

Neighborhood Park Features

- Minimum 2 graded playfields (may overlap with adjacent school site)
- Playgrounds
- Picnic areas with shelters







Neighborhood Park Features

- Walking/jogging paths
- Low level lighting for safety
- Restroom/ Drinking Fountain









Neighborhood Park Features

Neighborhood parks would not include activities or elements found in a large community park such as:

- Lighted baseball/ softball fields
- Swimming pools/ spray grounds

Neighborhood parks would not have large skate parks intended to serve the community beyond the immediate neighborhood.



Goals

- Establish community vision with programming possibilities
- Provide range of active and passive recreational and leisure opportunities for residences of all ages and abilities
- Provide sustainable design including water conserving landscapes
- Provide accessible (ADA) walks and park facilities
- Provide strong connections to adjacent schools and Second Creek



Goals

- Explore opportunity for shared parking and minimizing the impact of traffic
- Provide a diverse and aesthetically pleasing setting
- Design with respect to neighboring properties
- Provide a safe and highly visible neighborhood park setting
- Create a unique theme or identity for the neighborhood

Turnberry Voting Results


- 351 total ballots: 272 online and 79 physical (Sample ballot included in City Council packet)







