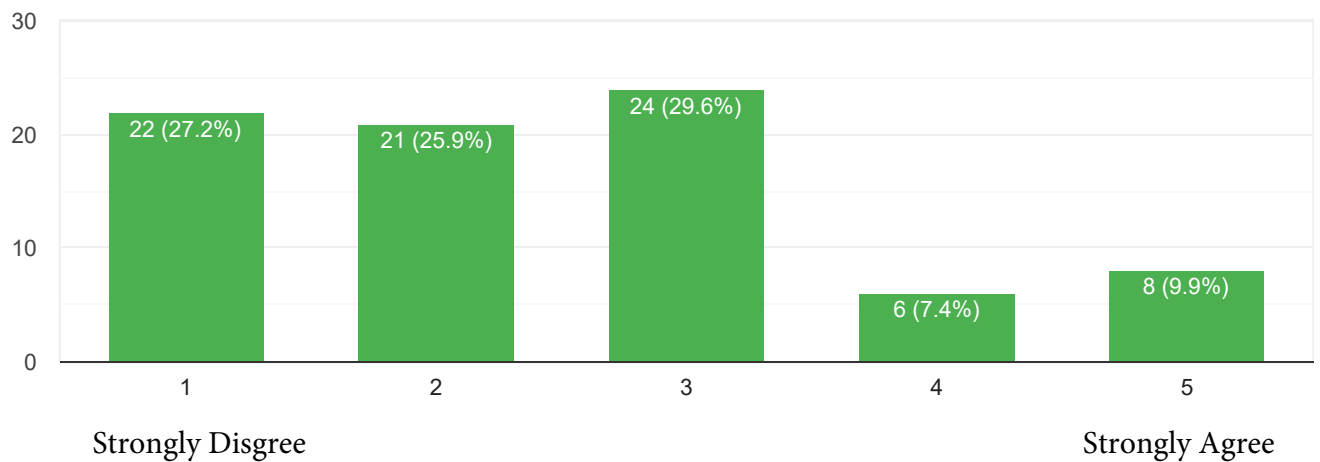

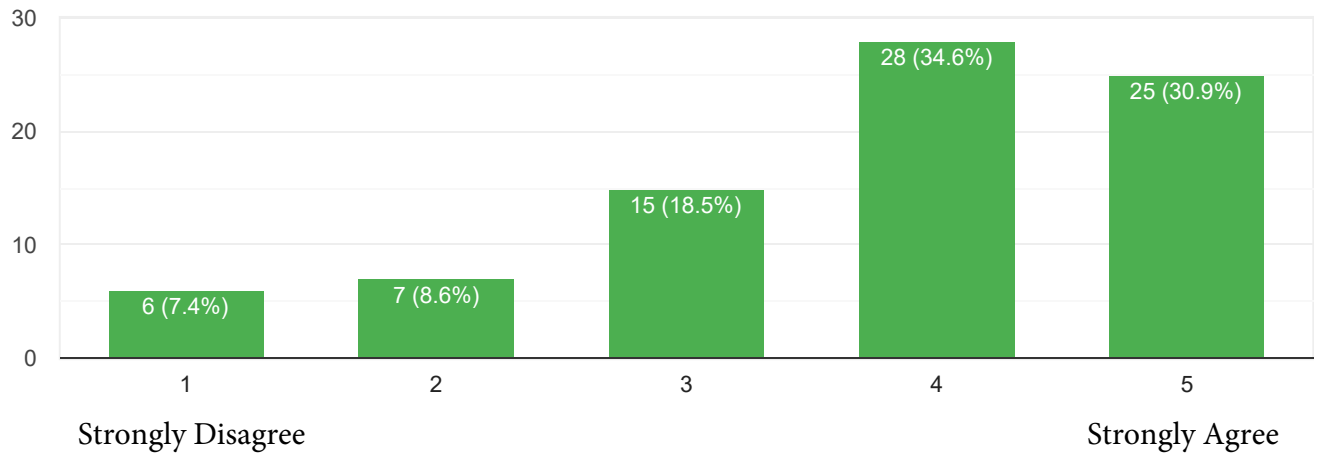
Do you feel that term limits hinder public participation in city boards and commissions?

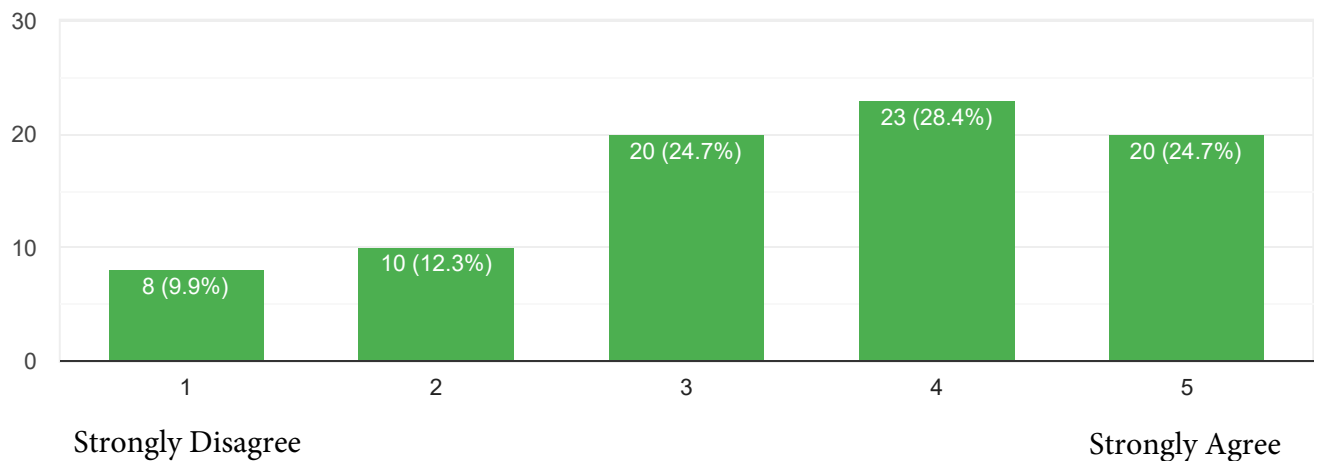
Do you feel like there should be term limits for board and commission leadership positions?

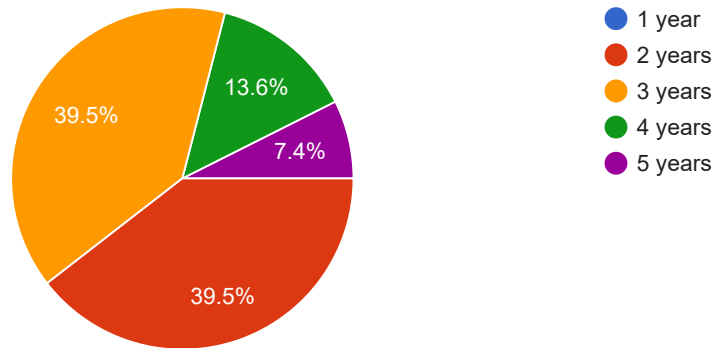
Do you feel there should be term limits for all board and commission appointments?

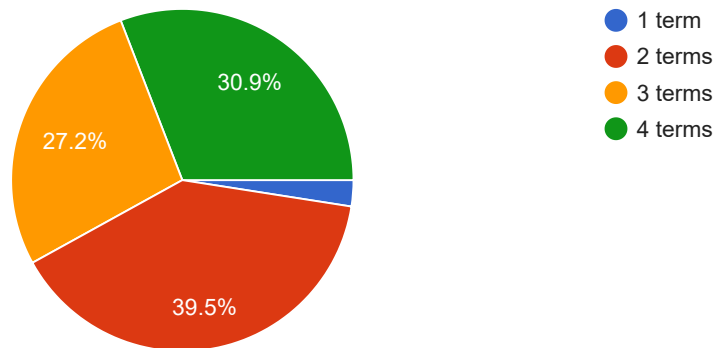
How long should a board or commission term last?

I feel that the current community doesn't become engaged in volunteering as was years ago. Setting limits could make a board without representation and unable to complete tasks that are addressed

COVID has a huge impact on the work our Commission is trying to do. We didn't meet for several months. Now we are meeting on Zoom. Personally, I think that whatever decision is reached on term limits. The quarantine months should not be counted as part of our terms. It takes awhile for new members to understand the work a board or commission is doing. So I think that allowing people to serve two or three terms is important, especially if the group is working on a special project.

Also, I would like to see a formal, annual introduction and training for all commissions and boards. I've served on one foundation and one commission in Commerce City. And neither provided any form of training or orientation for new members. So it can be quite confusing for new members until we have some
