## Proclamation

*WHEREAS, Indigenous People are at a disproportionate risk of experiencing violence, murder, or going missing and make up a significant portion of the missing and murdered cases reported to the Colorado Division of Criminal Justice; and*

*WHEREAS, on this Missing and Murdered Indigenous Persons Awareness Day, we reaffirm our commitment to honor the lives of murdered and missing Indigenous Persons, particularly women, girls, and Two-Spirit individuals, and continue to shine a light on egregious and unconscionable treatment towards and against indigenous people; and*

*WHEREAS, more than four out of five Indigenous People have experienced violence in their lifetime, including more than half who have experienced sexual violence; and*

*WHEREAS, as many as 85% of Indigenous Two-Spirit individuals who fulfill one of many mixed gender roles traditionally found in many Indigenous groups have been a victim of violence; and*

*WHEREAS, many Indigenous People continue to experience systemic and individual discrimination and indigenous women, girls, and Two-Spirit individuals experience highly disproportionate levels of life-threatening and gender-based violence, trauma, and exploitation; and*

*WHEREAS, surrounding Indigenous Nations continue to experience the loss of loved ones and we stand in solidarity with the families in Colorado and across Canada and the United States who have missing or murdered family members; and*

*NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the City Council of Commerce City hereby declares May 5, 2025 as Missing and Murdered Indigenous Persons Awareness Day in Commerce City and encourages all residents to educate themselves and increase their awareness of the crisis of missing and murdered Indigenous Peoples in Colorado and across Canada, Mexico and the United States.*
