The New England Journal of Medicine has this to say about Asymptomatic transmission. "We know that wearing a mask outside health care facilities offers little, if any, protection from infection. Public health authorities define a significant exposure to Covid-19 as face-to-face contact within 6 feet with a patient with symptomatic Covid-19 that is sustained for at least a few minutes (and some say more than 10 minutes or even 30 minutes). The chance of catching Covid-19 from a passing interaction in a public space is therefore minimal. In many cases, the desire for widespread masking is a reflexive reaction to anxiety over the pandemic."

You should not force anyone to wear a mask, especially since the science does not support it, there are only 247 people in the hospital with covid in the entire state and you want to have everyone wear a mask? Did you do this for Influenza every year? This should be our choice not yours. One small random poll on Nextdoor does not mean everyone in Commerce City should wear a mask. Business owners should also have the choice to enforce or not enforce wearing masks. Restaurants and some others should be allowed to open 100%, there is no massive outbreak in Commerce City, pay attention to the science not the politics.

I caught the virus back in April, I am 64 with no underlying issues, I had 3 days of flue like symptoms, with meds I was back to normal on day 7. I am now in my 12th week of a study by the CSU Med Center where I am tested and exposed to the virus each week, I tested negative again yesterday. That said I cannot catch the virus, and I am not able to spread it so why would I or anyone like me be forced to wear a mask?
