REQUEST

Approve an ordinance amending the Commerce City Revised Municipal Code (CCRMC) to provide for the prompt retrieval of surplus, contraband, or abandoned property to promote public safety and improve the appearance of the community. It is a further purpose of the amendment to ensure that certain items may be disposed of immediately to endure the health and safety of the community.

BACKGROUND

For the past several years staff has been enforcing the clean up of encampments around the City and several months ago Council passed an ordinance to ban shopping carts from public property and parks. Usually when the clean ups or cart removal occurs there is a great deal of personal property left behind that the staff must dispose of. Prior to disposal our policies and best practices require those items to be retained for 30 days to allow the owner to regain possession if they desire. Often the items found by the staff include perishable items or illegal substances. Current code does not make a distinction between those type items or any other items and requires all to be maintained for at least 30 days. This code change will allow staff to immediately dispose of illegal or perishable items without the need to hold for 30 days.
