ARPA Navigation Center Project

Overview

- City was allocated ~\$10.5 million in State and Local Fiscal Recovery Funds from the American Rescue Plan Act
- In Summer 2021, consensus Council direction was to "go big" and use funds to help address root causes of homelessness
- Project involves significant collaboration with Adams County and surrounding municipalities



Navigation Center

Part 1 – Project

- Navigation Center will have rooms for job training, counseling, and other resource navigation
 - Also includes temporary transitional housing aka "Pallet Shelters"
- Construction or Renovation of facility paid for with City ARPA funds
 - No funds have been formally spent/attributed at this point

Part 2 – Program

- Provision of services and programming at Navigation Center
 - Management of temporary transitional housing, connection to "Permanent Supportive Housing" opportunities in Metro Area
 - City to incur minimal on-going costs, Adams County to serve as managing entity



Next Steps

- If Council so chooses, staff to bring executive session for site selection
- <u>Council approval of budget ordinance</u> <u>to formally allocate ARPA funds</u>
- Begin architecture, design, and construction/renovation of facility

Collaborative Opportunities

- Adams County Homelessness Municipal Working Group
 - Coordinates projects and services with Adams County, all municipalities
- Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) from Working Group involves the following:
 - No commitment of resources/funds
 - Requires staff to attend monthly/quarterly meetings, which is already occurring
 - Working Group to provide policy recommendations to County, applicable municipalities on joint homelessness opportunities

Commerce

- MOU in packet for review

Collaborative Opportunities

- Navigation Center Network
 - Success of navigation center programming will rely on collaboration with other Metro homelessness resources
 - Utilization of Working Group to create connections, share data, and provide appropriate resources to clients
- Grant Opportunities
 - State Navigation Center Campus grant just approved by State Legislature
 - Staff in discussion with multiple Metro Denver governments on potential joint application
 - Other Homelessness Grants approved by Legislature forthcoming, no details available right now

- Formal collaborative agreements with Adams County
