- Staff executed a special promotion for Small Business Saturday utilizing the Open Rewards mobile software platform. Registered participating residents received 10% in rewards while shopping at local small businesses on Small Business Saturday.
- Staff received an update on a planned fast casual drivethru restaurant located near 62nd Ave, confirming the size and patron capacity and expected jobs at the new restaurant.
- Staff received an update on a proposed fueling facility addition near Tower Road.
- Staff assisted a developer with planning a potential ground-breaking for a new 100-room hotel along Tower Road.
- Staff assisted potential new employer in their real estate search for an approximately 7,000-square-foot facility.
- Staff received an update on a planned drive-thru coffee shop located near 62nd Ave, confirming the size and patron capacity and expected jobs at the new shop.
- Staff assisted a developer with permitting for a planned 12,000-square-foot commercial development located near Tower Road.
- Staff coordinated with engineering staff on a walking tour of 64th Ave. as part of the 64th Ave. Corridor Study and advised consulting team on commercial development needs and planned projects.
- Staff assisted CMO in selecting the consultant that will work with the city to create a Telecommunications Infrastructure Strategic Plan.

- Staff met with a representative from Master Halco, in connection with their recent acquisition of The Deck Superstore, in Commerce City, and their future.
- Staff met with various potential partners to continue program development for an ACT workforce training pathway program. Staff is developing an interagency agreement to define the scope of services and the roles of each party. Staff is participating in the hiring of the Education Navigator and coordinating with the Community Well-Being team on tasks for this position to support the workforce program.
- Staff met with Adams County ED and AC-Rep staff to prepare for initial meetings of the regional business retention and expansion (BRE) group led by AC-Rep and Adams County.
- Staff is coordinating with CD staff on planned actions for businesses at risk of being closed due to fire code violations and to plan for future business impact from the city's business registration process.
- Staff coordinated support for AC-Rep's new transportation sector partnership. Transportation businesses in C3 were invited to participate so that C3's business community is well represented.
- Staff continues to work with several project leads generated through the State, for which Commerce City sites have been suggested as potential investment locations.
- Staff reached out to Rocky Mountain Powertrain to assist with compliance with their existing incentives agreement, in preparation for annual reporting in January.
- Staff updated the vacancy tracker tool that shows all properties that a listed as available in the city.

Distinctive Highlights

- Hot Shot crews continued their dedication to providing debris—free streets for motorists and users on Commerce City's roadways.
- This week, crews removed a large debris dumping, reported via AccessC3, at Monaco Street and 63rd Place; as well as Olive Street and 64th Ave. Crews at both locations found and disposed of various items including, mattresses, T.Vs, chairs, and other pieces of furniture.
- Due to the Thanksgiving holiday, crews were unable to empty the RTD trash receptacles in the Core City, but the team will be back on their regularly scheduled time for receptacle pick up for the weeks to come.
- Hot Shot crews were notified of 14 tires in various places throughout the city. The tires were taken to the recycling center to promote proper disposal and sustainability.

Infrastructure

PW Updates

Engineering

- Construction continued along Colorado Boulevard. Construction
 on the storm sewer and curb for the northbound lane was
 ongoing, and the connection to the water services main line was
 made. The project is still on track to be completed by the end of
 2024.
- Construction on 62nd and Holly Street neared completion with final ramp work, and the project is expected to be closed by mid-December.
- On Tuesday, Nov. 26, Engineering staff attended a coordination meeting with South Adams County Water and Sanitation District (SACWSD) and Buffalo Run Metropolitan District regarding sewer line replacement for 120th Avenue.
- A bidder was selected for the East 88th Avenue 'Segment A' and the item is scheduled to go before the City Council on Monday, Dec. 16
- Another bidder was selected for the Potomac Street Bridge and this project is scheduled to go before City Council on Monday, Dec. 16.

Streets

- Sweeping Operation crews assisted with roadway clean-up on 96th and Tower after an accident occurred.
- Sweeping Operation crews continued their winter sweeping schedule. This week, crews swept Quebec Parkway and Prairie Parkway. Both of the city's sweepers are fully functional and in operation.
- An AccessC3 request regarding gas on the roadway of E. 119th
 Ave. was addressed and cleaned up immediately.
- Streets Operations crews were on snow shift from Tuesday, Nov. 26 (in the evening) to Wednesday, Nov. 27. Crews were plowing and treating the many streets within Commerce City.
- Stormwater crews completed stormwater inlet cleaning, storm basin cleanings, and inspections. There are still 9 inlets and basins in the process of getting cleaned and inspected.
- The pavement team started a crack seal project at Buffalo Run Golf Course. The project is approximately 35% completed as of last week. The project will continue until full completion.

Parks Operations

- Parks Operations staff started the work week with pressure washing the shelters and main entrance at Eagle Pointe Recreation Center and Veterans Memorial Park.
- In addition to pressure washing areas around Eagle Pointe, the team also completed the shrub bed, tree pruning, and general clean-up around the recreation center.
- Parks Operations staff immediately addressed and cleaned the graffiti found at Sand Creek Trail, near Sapp Brothers truck stop.
- All Parks Operations Teams were hands on deck in completing the installation of the Christmas Tree at Commerce City's Civic Center. The team also created the light switch that will be used to turn on Commerce City's Christmas Tree for the tree-lighting celebration.
- Due to the influx of geese migrating to our region, Parks staff installed 30 coyotes to keep the geese off Commerce City's maintained fields.
- Parks Maintenance staff assisted with Snow Operations on Wednesday, Nov. 27 around the various sidewalks and parking lots on Commerce City property.


