

EXHIBIT A TO ORDINANCE 2676

Sec. 2-3011. Arts & Culture Commission.

- (a) *Powers.* The Arts & Culture Commission shall advise the City Council on matters related to the advancement and preservation of art, music, theater, and dance. The Commission will:
 - a. Make recommendations pertaining to the selection and placement of public art pieces throughout the City;
 - b. Conduct regular reviews and make recommendations to the City Council for the approval of, or the revisions to, the City's Public Arts Master Plan;
 - c. Host art and cultural events throughout the City including, but not limited to, Music in the Parks;
 - d. Collaborate with staff to identify grant opportunities that support public art and cultural events, ensuring eligibility opportunities are forwarded to the City Manager or their designee for application;
 - e. Participate in public engagement processes related to the Commission's work;
 - f. Promote public awareness and understanding of art, music, theater, and dance in the City; and
 - g. Advocate for art, music, theater, and dance that support and improve community belonging and pride.
- (b) *Composition and qualifications.* The City Council shall appoint up to fifteen (15) commission members as follows: up to thirteen (13) regular voting members and two (2) City Council members who shall be non-voting.
- (c) *Terms of office.* Except for vacancies in unexpired terms, which shall be filled in accordance with the Charter, the appointment of city council members whose terms shall coincide with the organization meetings of the city council, and any appointments made to ensure the appropriate staggering of terms, members shall be appointed for a period of three (3) years and shall serve no more than two (2) consecutive terms or until a successor has been appointed.
- (d) *Meetings.* The Commission shall meet as necessary to perform its duties. Notice of any meeting of the commission, and the agenda for such meeting, shall be posted on the city's website.
- (e) *Quorum.* Seven (7) regular voting members shall constitute a quorum.
