

Adams Heights Concerns



Introduction

 During the December 2, 2024 Regular City Council Meeting City Council motioned to direct the City Manager to have a comprehensive report about the efforts being made by the City staff to deal with the problems that have arisen regarding the issues at 68th and Albion. This motion passed unanimously with all nine council members voting yes.



Public Works Improvements

- 68th Avenue Multi-Modal Project: Ongoing project to add traffic calming measures to improve safety and connectivity.
- 68th Avenue Mill, Overlay, and Restripe: Added traffic calming measures for Alsup Elementary in 2022.

- Speed Humps: Installed in 2021 and 2022.
- **Signage:** All truck restriction signs replaced in 2023.
- 68th Avenue Striping Modification: Added traffic calming measures in 2023.



Public Works Improvements

- Site Visit: Staff visited area of concern to identify and resolve issues.
- Speed Data Collection: Recent data collection confirmed speeds had decreased from before 2021 speed hump installation.
- Annual Storm Water Cleaning: Cleaned for sediment and debris in 2024.
- Sweeping Program: Completed as scheduled and other sweeping dates added.



Police Department Improvements

- Established CMV Unit: Multiple operations were completed within the City.
- CMV Certifications: One officer is level one certified and others are completing the process.
- CMV Data: Data was collected and analyzed from operations in the area.

- Incident Log: Staff identified the number of calls (1,900) and citations (260) for the area since 2022.
- Targeted Enforcement: Staff implemented a targeted enforcement plan.



Police Department Improvements

- CMV Messaging: Multiple modes of communication have taken place by staff.
- Pole Camera Installation: Installed two cameras that are regularly monitored by staff.
- Speed Study: The studies found that speed limits were on average being followed.
- Signage: Installed a VMS board.



Conclusion

• An estimated \$2,018,060 has been spent to address the concerns raised in the Adams Heights area between 2021-2024.
