September 28: Compressor C-3802 shut off due to an internal failure. A back up emergency compressor (No. 641695) took over and started operating. During this time the emergency compressor (No. 641695) exceeded 500 hours of use within a 12-month rolling period.

October 4: An open-ended line on Drum No. D-349 was identified. Per applicable leak detection and repair provisions, under most circumstances it is not permissible to have an open-ended line.
