## RESOLUTION ADOPTING CITY PROCUREMENT POLICY AND ESTABLISHING EFFECTIVE DATES THEREFOR

## NO. 2014-38

WHEREAS, the Council of the City of Commerce City (the "City Council") desires to establish standards for the City of Commerce City's (the "City") procurement process in a manner that reflects the City Values of Teamwork, Communication, Respect, Honesty/Integrity, Community, Competence/Knowledge, Achievement and Creativity/Innovation;

WHEREAS, as stewards of the public trust, the City Council further desires to reflect in the City's procurement process the following goals: (i) obtaining the best value for Commerce City taxpayers; (ii) acquiring the highest quality goods and services; (iii) achieving peak results; (iv) providing an open process; (v) ensuring effectiveness and efficiency through a streamlined procurement process; and (vi) retaining adequate controls over procurement; and

WHEREAS, the City Council hereby finds and determines that the attached Procurement Policy (the "Procurement Policy") achieves the foregoing goals, is reflective of the City Values and is in the best interests of the residents of the City.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF COMMERCE CITY, COLORADO, AS FOLLOWS:

- 1. <u>Adoption</u>. The Procurement Policy is hereby adopted.
- 2. <u>Effective Dates</u>. The Procurement Policy shall be effective as follows:
  - a. The Procurement Policy shall be effective immediately for all procurements related to the five (5) "2K" projects, the financing for which voter approval was sought pursuant to Issue 2K on the November 2013, City-wide ballot.
  - b. The Procurement Policy shall become effective January 1, 2015, for all procurements not identified in subsection "a" above.
