

- Successful implementation of this Public Art Master Plan may require sustainable funding sources


#### RECOMMENDATIONS

#### **RECOMMENDATIONS**

Pursue a part-time administrator. The administrator may be tasked with overseeing the public art fund, distribution and collection of public art requests for proposals.

#### RECOMMENDATION #1

Initiate with City Council discussions about a percent for public art program through CIP funding.

# RECOMMENDATION #2

Recommend that City Council adopt, by ordinance, a standard for incorporation into the City's Land Development Code.

## RECOMMENDATION #3

Identify a process for establishing new themes for private development that are in accordance with this plan.

## RECOMMENDATION #4

Engage City Council to discuss the allocation of public spaces as a new development requirement.

#### RECOMMENDATION #5

Cultural Council, City Council, and staff should discuss the adoption of potential ordinances to acquire public art fee-in-lieu from private development.
