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City's Budget Philosophy

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- 1. Balanced budget where ongoing expenditures match ongoing revenues evaluating expenditures in current year & next budget year
- 2. Direct one-time revenues toward one-time expenditures & capital projects
- 3. Keep our workforce whole (employees are our #1 resource)
- 4. Provide first class service to our citizens & public; maintain current service levels
- 5. Continually improve operational efficiency
- 6. Project at least one year in advance to anticipate future budget situations
- 7. Position City to sustain economic downturns & robust growth
- 8. Maintain healthy reserves & use them as last resort
- 9. Continue to implement City Council goals & various approved City plans
- Have decisions made by Sept 2 to finalize the process for presentation Oct 19
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Budget Accomplishments

- Staff was asked to present flat budget requests (except for contractual increases) & they have done well coming back with reasonable requests
- City Manager has reviewed and approved budget requests that align with the City's strategic goals and fit within resource constraints
