

City Council Presentation May 9, 2016

• The Prairieways Action Plan includes connections throughout the Northern Range



- Existing trails include:
  - Second Creek Trail- 4.5 miles from 108<sup>th</sup> Ave.
    south to 96<sup>th</sup> Ave. with two loops; one north of 104<sup>th</sup> and one south of 104<sup>th</sup>
  - Rocky Mountain Arsenal National Wildlife
    Refuge (RMANWR) Perimeter Trail- 11 miles
    from the Prairie Gateway Open Space around the
    Refuge to 81<sup>st</sup> Ave.
  - Multi-Use Paths along major arterials and connecting parks and schools.





- New recreation center will be located at 112<sup>th</sup> and Potomac.
- The goal is to provide trail connections for all residents in the city to access the new recreation center.



- Construction drawings for the Northern Range Loop Trail are almost complete
- This loop trail will take users from 96<sup>th</sup> Ave. north along the O'Brian Canal Trail to the future Second Creek Community Park site and new recreation center then south along Second Creek to connect with the existing Second Creek Trail section and then to the RMANWR Perimeter Trail



- Users could also take the multi-use path along 104<sup>th</sup> Ave. to create a shorter loop
- Connections will also be built for River Run and River Oaks residents to cross underneath I-76 and connect to the O'Brian Canal Trail
- A bridge will be constructed to connect Buckley Ranch to the Second Creek Trail





#### • Timelines

- Planning & design of the loop trail and connections will be completed in 2016/2017 with construction completed by Q1 2018
- Tower Rd. and associated multi-use path and bike lanes will be completed in late 2017
- Highway 2 and associated multi-use path and bike lanes will be completed in spring 2018.
- 104 Ave. is complete from Highway 85 to Tower Rd.

Commerce

 – 112<sup>th</sup> Ave. is scheduled for access to the new recreation center

## **Historic City Connections**

- Highway 2 widening includes bike lanes and a multi-use path along the majority of the project
- PW continues to implement Walk Bike Fit as a part of the Transportation Master Plan
  - Sidewalk connection from 56<sup>th</sup> and Eudora, under I-270 to the Dahlia Trailhead
- Improvements planned to 72<sup>nd</sup> Ave. as a part of a Safe Routes to School grant

### **Historic City Connections**

- Another Safe Routes to School grant includes:
  - Maps showing safe biking and walking routes created and distributed to students at Monaco and Dupont elementary schools; these maps will also be available at city events
  - Bike repair stations installed at Dupont Elementary, Monaco Elementary, Urquidez-Centennial Park and Los Valientes Park

- FLAP- Federal Lands Access Program
  - Goal is to improve state and local transportation facilities that provide access to and through federal lands for visitors, recreationists, and resource users
- Commerce City working with U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service at the RMANWR, Denver, and Adams County on a grant application



- Proposed FLAP projects in Commerce City include:
  - Modify existing trail leading to the Refuge to accommodate the new grand archway entrance
  - Two new entrances to the Refuge at the northeast corner: 96<sup>th</sup> and Chambers and just south of 96<sup>th</sup> and Buckley
  - Trail connections from new entrances to a new overlook at Henderson Hill

- A total of \$700,000 is being requested including projects in both Commerce City and Denver.
- Approximately \$480,000 would be spent in Commerce City with the City providing a maximum contribution of just over \$80,000 (from an existing funding source.)
- Next Monday a resolution acknowledging the city's support for the grant application will be on the City Council agenda.



#### Fronterra/Reunion Communities



- FLAP applications are due May 21, 2016
- Funding decisions will be made in September 2016
- There is a 5 year funding window; if funds are awarded they could be received anytime between 2017 and 2021.
- If funding is received, it will likely be several years before these projects are completed
