Program Objectives

- Ensure city rights-of-way and open space areas are maintained in accordance with city ordinance and the Noxious Weed Management Plan
- Improve aesthetics within the community
- Maintain sight lines for motorists and pedestrians
- Proactively plan & complete activities to minimize the occurrence of weeds in public corridors



Program Overview

- Public Works Department manages all open space areas and rights-of-way
- Parks, Recreation & Gold Department manages parks and areas adjacent to major trails
- All rights-of-way locations have been identified and mapped; working to complete mapping of open space
- Public Works contracted with Adams County in 2015 to identify and spray noxious weeds located within various rights-of-way and open space locations
