Purpose of this Presentation

- This is a follow-up to the Water Acquisition fee presentation on November 14, 2016
- Purpose and desired outcome:
 - The purpose is to obtain Council direction on the water acquisition fee annual inflator



Background

- When City prepared Long-Range Financial Plan in early 2000's, water for future City facilities was identified as a major unfunded future obligation
- In 2003 Ordinance 1402 established fee & set the annual fee escalation at 10% per year



Current Fee Escalator

- Now fee escalator is frozen temporarily
- Will go back to 10% effective 2019-1-1, unless changed



Research

- Staff research found compounded annual growth in water prices for past 10 years:
 - Western US water rights inflated at 9.4%/year
 - South Platte River Valley water rights inflated
 8.8%/year
 - But South Platte River Valley included Colorado-Big Thompson water rights, which skews it higher, and groundwater rights that skew it lower
 - Can get WestWater Research report specific to Denver area for \$4,850
 Commerce

Recommendation

Staff recommendation is to go with the 8.8%/year
