RESOLUTION IN SUPPORT OF PUBLIC ART INSTALLATION FOR THE NEW RECREATION CENTER AT SECOND CREEK NO. 2017-40

WHEREAS, the City of Commerce City (the "City") approved a 1% public art funding program in 2014 to provide a means to fund the acquisition of public art by the City, which art shall become part of the City's public art collection; and

WHEREAS, the City's Public Art Master Plan identifies a process for public art administration and commissioning of artworks in spaces accessible to the public; and

WHEREAS, the 1% funding requirement applies to the City's voter-approved capital improvement program projects, including the new recreation center at Second Creek; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with the Public Art Master Plan, the New Recreation Center at Second Creek Public Art Selection Committee has selected public art proposals by John King for the lobby center, public art proposal "Trail Blazers" by Don Kennell for the north side visible to Highway 2, and public art proposals by Josh Weiner for the roundabouts on the south side along 112th Avenue; and

WHEREAS, on April 11, 2017, the Commerce City Cultural Council reviewed the selection committee's recommendation for the new recreation center at Second Creek and announced its unanimous support for the selection of art proposals for three sites; and

WHEREAS, the Cultural Council formally advances the recommendations and requests that the City Council adopt a resolution in support of the public art commission.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF COMMERCE CITY, COLORADO, AS FOLLOWS:

1. The City Council hereby endorses the recommendation by the Commerce City Cultural Council and declares its support for the public art projects by artist John King for placement in lobby center, "Trail Blazers" by artist Don Kennell for placement on the north side visible to Highway 2, and by artist Josh Weiner for placement in the roundabouts on the south side along 112th Avenue consistent with the Commerce City Public Art Master Plan.
