Background

- Council policy #CP-7 states that it is the intent of Council to provide an organized and uniform process for naming of city facilities
- Council has delegated recommendation authority to Parks, Recreation & Golf Advisory Committee
- City Council has final approval on naming city facilities





Naming Contest

- Naming facilities can help promote the amenity and generate pride among users
- At the June 27, 2016 study session, Council agreed that the recreation centers would be named simultaneously
- PRG Advisory Committee launched naming contest to obtain facility name ideas from the community
- Contest was promoted through variety of channels January-April 2017. Online and paper entries were accepted
- Winner(s) will be a part of sign unveiling ceremony and receive a free one year family membership to facility

Results

- Parks, Recreation & Golf Advisory Committee reviewed entries at April 18 meeting
- New recreation center: 289 total entries
- Existing recreation center: 202 total entries





Consensus Decision-Making

- The committee used a thoughtful, consensus decision-making process to recommend the names
- Consensus is a process where the input of everyone is carefully considered and an outcome is crafted that best meets the needs of the group









- Entries were narrowed down within the categories and suggested criteria
- The process continued until the committee refined the list to their top four names
- The two alternate names selected were: NEW CENTER: Trailblazer Recreation Center EXISTING CENTER: Pioneer Recreation Center
