Re: Private Activity Bond Transfer for Holly Park Apartments

Dear Ms. Carstens:

Colorado Housing and Finance Authority (CHFA) respectfully requests the City of Commerce City to assign \$2,668,200 from its 2017 Private Activity Bond (PAB) allocation to support the Holly Park Apartments family housing project being renovated in your community.

The total project cost for this substantial renovation is \$47.3 million, with \$26 million coming from PAB funding. The project also received an allocation of non-competitive tax credits to reduce the amount of debt on the property.

This 168-unit project, located at 5524 E. 60<sup>th</sup> Avenue, is preparing to close and begin construction within the next month. The one-, two-, three- and four bedroom units will serve working families with incomes at 50% of the Area Median Income (AMI), or \$40,050 for a family of four. Mercy Housing will continue to own and manage the property.
