# Seniors in Adams County

What is being worked on?

- Poverty Reduction Taskforce was established to look at specific groups of people and geographic areas in the county. Dozens of agencies have been involved. "Seniors" were a specific group that was targeted.
  - Seniors Poverty Reduction group focused on three key areas:
    - Affordable Housing for Low to Moderate income seniors
    - Affordable and appropriate Transportation options
    - Ease of access to Public assistance programs and community resources
- o Community Enrichment Facebook Page
  - Established to give a portal to county, municipality and non-profit providers a place to share resources, fairs and other events aimed at helping county citizens.
- o Mapping of multiple demographics in the county
  - Data was gathered to show numerous factors involved in poverty including:
    - Transportation (where people come and go from)
    - Neighborhoods with high levels of poverty
    - How to target outreach

- o Aging Well in Adams County webpage
  - Webpage designed for seniors and their caregivers to share community resources.
    - Aimed at working on Easing the access to Public Assistance and Community Resources
