## Purpose for Incentives Program

- Current program adopted by City Council Resolution 2014-56.
- Tool used to help attract businesses to Commerce City.
- Performance based.
- Partner with community organizations to create comprehensive incentives package.

## Project Overview

## Estimated initial capital investment: \$10 million

- $\$ 7.5$ million for track equipment, testing rigs and system vehicles
- $\$ 1.5$ for facility construction and/or improvements
- $\$ 1$ million for track site development

Estimated job creation: up to 75 jobs over 3 years Average annual wage: $\mathbf{\$ 9 9 , 7 0 4}$

Estimated city tax and fees collected: \$390,266

- Construction $4.5 \%$ use tax: $\$ 40,500$
- Building permit and plan check fees collected: \$12,266
- $4.5 \%$ sales/use tax on track materials: $\$ 337,500$


## Proposed Business Incentives

Incentive request complies with current program adopted by City Council (Resolution 2014-56).

Proposed Incentives

- $60 \%$ rebate of non-dedicated sales and/or use tax (3.5\% tax basis) on capital investment
- $50 \%$ rebate of building permit and plan check fees
- Estimated city incentives value* = \$182,500
* Final incentives amount determined by actual taxes collected and fees paid in conjunction with the capital investment.



## Anticipated Community Benefits

- This project helps to meet City Council Goal \#1: Develop a balanced and vibrant economy to improve socioeconomic status; and Outcome \#1.3 to create a diverse mix of businesses within the city.
- This project helps diversify existing industry base and may attract additional high tech research and development (R\&D) companies to the city.
- Company expects a high number of visitors from investors, as well as other research engineers. This supports greater opportunity for hotels, restaurants and other commercial development in the area.
- Project may create up to 75 new, high income jobs in the community over three (3) years.
