#### **CASES**

- Derby Review Board processed 5 cases in 2016, 10 cases in 2017, and 5 cases so far in 2018
- Cases included signage, windows, fencing,
  landscaping, exterior renovation (including paint, and new construction. The DRB also approved a
  Wayfinding Signage and Lighting Plan for future strategic investments in the district.

## Catalyst Fund Program



- Adopted policy for allocating catalyst funds
  - Maximum amount for individual applicant per year- up to \$25,000
  - Lapse period for approved funds if not used
  - Ability to fund city initiated projects that will impact the district as a whole

### Catalyst Fund Program



- Catalyst Utilization
  - **2015:** \$20,405
  - **2016**: \$90,554
  - **2**017: \$69,223
  - 2018: \$17,172 (year to date)

# Signage and Lighting



- Project Origins
  - Community feedback during Open Houses for improved safety/perceived safety and better district/business identification.
  - DRB approved funds in fall 2016
  - Consultants hired, project kick-off spring 2017







#### **Implementation**




- Priorities (Signage)

- Priorities (Lighting)
  - Small Area Poles (internal)
  - Pedestrian Poles (parks/plazas)
  - Festival Lighting (Derby Diamond)
  - Large Area Poles (72<sup>nd</sup> Ave)
