AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE 2020 BUDGET OF THE CITY OF COMMERCE CITY,  
COLORADO BY RECOGNIZING CARES ACT FUNDING AND AUTHORIZING THE  
EXECUTION OF A RELATED INTERGOVERNMENTAL AGREEMENT

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF COMMERCE CITY,  
COLORADO AS FOLLOWS:

**SECTION 1.** The City of Commerce City, Colorado (“City”) desires to authorize the receipt and expenditure of funding for costs incurred in fighting and ameliorating the effects of SARS-CoV-2 and COVID-19, as provided by the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security Act, P.L. 116-136 (“CARES Act”), which provides provide relief funds to individuals, businesses, and state and local governments. Adams County, Colorado and the City desire to establish terms and conditions for the receipt and expenditure of CARES funding. This ordinance shall be effective immediately upon passage.

**SECTION 2.** The passage of this ordinance as an emergency ordinance is necessary for the preservation of the public health, safety, and welfare ordinance.

**SECTION 3.** The Intergovernmental Agreement, substantially in the form attached as Exhibit A hereto, is found to be in the best interests of the public and is hereby approved, subject to the creation of its Exhibit A. The Mayor is authorized to execute, and the City Clerk to attest, the Intergovernmental Agreement on behalf of the City upon creation of Exhibit A to the Intergovernmental Agreement. The City Manager is authorized to approve a final Exhibit A prior to execution by the Mayor.

**SECTION 4.** The 2020 Budget of the City of Commerce City, Colorado is amended by the recognition of CARES Act funding in the amount of \$4,646,885.00 for the purposes authorized by the CARES Act (General Fund).
