The removal of old sheet piling grade control structures be replaced with the more environmentally and aesthetically version currently being implemented by the Mile High Flood District. Such structures provide improved water quality for aquatic life through better mixing of the stream water which can improve the water's pH and Dissolved Oxygen. They also provide the ability for native fish populations to move upstream and downstream which increases the propagation of fish. Additionally, such structures improve the macroinvertebrate (aquatic insects) habitat. Macroinvertebrates are an essential indicator of aquatic health and is the primary food source of native fish. Finally the removal of such structure will greatly improve the overall appearance of the creek and Sand Creek Greenway, from the appearance of an archaic industrial age to one that is more natural in appearance and create a more enjoyable outdoor experience for the citizens of Commerce City and other Restoration, Public Health, surrounding municipalities who recreate and commute | Community Visual or along Sand Creek.

When physical activities should be reduced, what alternatives are there for vulnerable citizens? (children, seniors, and anyone with a respiratory illness). Does the city have a place (e.g., indoor gym) that can be opened to the public for alternative exercise or for simply hanging out in a low-pollution indoor environment? If so, how is that communicated? If not, how can that be created? Working with a local health clinic, we propose a comprehensive strategy for a) increased education about what to do; b) concrete resources to support activities to keep residents safe; c) increased monitoring of individual vulnerable citizens to determine what barriers they have to reducing exposure to unsafe levels of pollutants. Self-awareness of the individual behaviors that can help reduce risk, especially among vulnerable citizens, specific concrete resources that would support the selection of healthy behaviors (wearing a face mask, going to the indoor gym when it is unhealthy outside, using a free bus pass for transportation on days of unhealthy air) and perhaps, a reduction in acute adverse health events (e.g., asthma attacks, emergency room visits).
