

## **Ordinance 2266 – Noble Amendment 2 (Second Reading) – Setback from Plugged and Abandoned Wells**

**Purpose:** To increase plat requirements restricting habitable structure distance from plugged and abandoned wells and other facilities from 50' to 150'.

**Motion:** I move to amend Ordinance 2266 in Exhibit G, by increasing the plat restriction for habitable structures from plugged and abandoned wells to 150 feet as shown in the document titled "Noble Amendment 2 (Second Reading) – Setback from Plugged and Abandoned Wells."

### **Sec. 21-6280. Additional Subdivision Standards relating to Oil & Gas Sites**

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(3) Plat requirements.

- a. ~~No final plat shall be approved that does not contain the following~~  
~~shall be denoted on all final plats:~~  

- i. The location of any oil and gas wells, flowlines, and gathering lines, and any associated easements;
  - ii. The location of all recorded surface use agreements; and
  - iii. The location of any plugged and abandoned oil and gas wells, flowlines and gathering lines, including a plat designation surrounding such wells and expressly prohibiting any habitable building or structure within ~~150~~ feet;
