- Outreach to developers on mixed-use projects based on retail plan recommendations

- Comp Plan updates underway

- Developed Veteran Internship Program
- Needs assessments for performance evaluations and employee policies
- HR process improvements and streamlining orientation
- Training



Provide responsive action to council-identified priorities

• Utilizing Microsoft Planner to track and allow for faster and fuller responses to Council action items

#### Act in a transparent and accountable manner

- Increasing information to the public in English and Spanish
  - 8 press releases, 49 news items, 4 community workshops, 1 forum

143 CORA requests processed



#### Secure a sustainable financial future

- Budget process is on-going
  - 2022 CIPP process submissions due in April
  - City Council budget session in August with annual budget retreat in September
- Clean audit opinion anticipated
- Tax compliance awareness

 Develop and maintain the public infrastructure to improve community appearance and encourage continued development



#### Develop educational infrastructure

• Promising discussions with Adams 14 on future collaboration opportunities



#### Improve physical infrastructure

- Derby solar lighting project is moving forward with significant interagency cooperation
- Increased coordination with SACWSD, especially regarding CIPP planning



#### Engineer a safe built environment

- PW has performed condition assessments
- Awarded several grants for significant upgrades to key problem areas
- Inspections/code enforcement efforts limited to planning/outreach due to health restrictions

Complete all approved phases of CIPP on time, budget, and to standard

• Created draft project management training program to streamline operations



#### Goal 4

• Promote resident health, safety and education



#### Create aesthetically pleasing neighborhoods

- Parking/trailer ordinance passed
- PD/CR beginning enforcement and public outreach
- Code Enforcement has been active making 663 contacts
- Housing is administering 135 vouchers

#### Provide recreation opportunities

- Program expansion limited due to COVID, planning for future underway
- PRG has applied for over \$1M in grants



#### Safeguard resident health and wellbeing

- Oil and gas LDC updates adopted
- Keep Commerce City Clean interdepartmental working group developing solutions
- Community Navigator for Homelessness Outreach hired



#### Enhance personal safety

- Assessed PD ability to accurately report, investigate, respond to domestic violence
  - Practice review has identified areas for improvement
- Decreasing auto thefts an uphill battle
  - Focus on intelligence-based investigations and community education



#### Enhance community safety

- Decrease in Priority 0 and 1 call response time
  - Resource allocation and monitoring calls for repeat offenders as well as community policing efforts
- Increasing community engagement
  - Virtual community meetings

• Improve community involvement and trust



#### Increase civic pride

- In-person events cancelled due to COVID
  - Planning for Q2 and Q3 events underway
- Hiring of cultural master plan consultant approved



#### Improve citizen interaction

• City continues to maintain an active web and social media presence



#### An inclusive community

- The Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) team has reconnected
- Diversity and Inclusion Commission created and met for first time
- Live Spanish interpretation offered at 21 city meetings

#### Improve citizen participation

- Charter amendment consensus for City
  Council representation to be placed on 2023 ballot
- Video production specialist hired
- City Council meetings continue in virtual environment
