AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 21-5214 OF THE CITY OF COMMERCE CITY LAND DEVELOPMENT CODE BY REMOVING THE SEPARATION REQUIREMENT BETWEEN LIQUOR STORES, TAVERNS, BEER AND WINE BUSINESSES ABSENT A USE BY PERMIT.

Summary and Background Information:

Circumstances and land uses have changed dramatically over the past decade as it relates to alcohol uses. More than ever, eating, drinking, and lodging establishments are a priority of this community. In an effort to make the city more ‘business friendly’ and to respond to updating our regulations to be in-line with surrounding jurisdictions and state laws, the following updates are proposed to the city codes:

- Update the LDC to eliminate separation requirements (currently 2500’) for taverns, beer and wine establishments, and liquor stores.
