AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE COMMERCE CITY REVISED MUNICIPAL CODE AND FURTHER AMENDING THE MODEL TRAFFIC CODE TO REGULATE THE PARKING OF VEHICLES IN RESIDENTIAL AREAS AND ABANDONMENT AND TOWING OF VEHICLES

The proposed ordinance amends the City's code provisions regarding parking on public streets and in residential districts. Council discussed this ordinance during a study session on November 23, 2020. The ordinance:

- Extends the time restriction for parking in residential districts from 5 to 24 hours unless the vehicle is immediately adjacent to property owned or occupied by the vehicle's user (12-1202(n)).
- Confirms that the City's regulations do not prevent homeowners associations from the private enforcement of applicable restrictive covenants against property owners subject to those covenants (11-1202(n); 11-2102).
- Clarifies provisions related to parking of oversized vehicles on private property in residential areas (11-2102).
- Updates provisions related to abandoned vehicles and towing to be consistent with state law (11-41, 11-43, 11-45, 11-46, and 11-47).

This ordinance does not include parking of RVs, trailers, or work trucks, which is deferred to a future discussion. An adjustment of parking fines will be presented at a later date.
