BACKGROUND/REQUEST

Purpose

At the direction of City Council, staff is coordinating tours of communities in the Denver metro area to explore best practices, development models, and creative approaches to community identity, placemaking, and economic vitality. Town of Parker, Colorado

Community Character: Suburban setting with a family-oriented atmosphere, emphasizing traditional downtown redevelopment and historic preservation.
