

ORDINANCE NO. 2729

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 2-3009 OF THE COMMERCE CITY REVISED MUNICIPAL CODE TO MODIFY THE QUORUM REQUIREMENTS FOR THE ENVIRONMENTAL POLICY AND INNOVATION COMMISSION

WHEREAS, the City Council for the City of Commerce City established the Environmental Policy and Innovation Commission (“EPIC”) to advise the City Council by identifying and recommending strategies to mitigate the negative effects of industrial activities on Commerce City residents; identifying ways to support and promote City businesses that adopt non-toxic, sustainable, and environmentally friendly practices; identify cutting-edge technologies and policies that the City may consider to improve environmental quality and community well-being; facilitate community engagement, transparency, and education on environmental issues while identifying potential solutions; provide policy, regulation, and incentive recommendations to City Council that may be considered to support the City's environmental and economic goals; monitor the City's environmental initiatives and report findings to the City Council; and host informational events and seminars; and

WHEREAS, the City Council deems it appropriate to modify the quorum requirements for EPIC to ensure EPIC business is conducted in an effective and time manner.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF COMMERCE CITY, COLORADO, AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. Findings. The recitals to this ordinance are incorporated as findings of the City Council. This ordinance is found to be supported and authorized by law and in the best interests of and necessary for the protection of the health, safety, and welfare of the public.

SECTION 2. Amendment. Section 2-3009 of the Commerce City Revised Municipal Code is hereby amended as set forth in Exhibit A, which the changes are reflected in a clean version set forth in Exhibit B.

SECTION 3. Repealer. All ordinances or portions thereof inconsistent or conflicting with this ordinance or any portion hereof, are hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistency.

SECTION 4. Effective Date. This ordinance shall be effective pursuant to Section 5.3 of the Charter.
