



Emergency Operations Plan (EOP) Overview

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What is an EOP?

- An Emergency Operations Plan is a document that outlines the policies, procedures, and responsibilities for an organization or jurisdiction to respond to an emergency or disaster.



What is the Purpose?

- The purpose of an EOP is to provide general guidelines and principles for managing and coordinating the overall response activities before, during, and after emergencies and disasters.



Parts of the EOP

- The Basic Plan.

Provides an overview of the preparedness and response strategies.

- Lead and Support Agencies Section.

Describes the emergency functions for departments and outside agencies.

- Hazards/Threats Specific Section.

Addresses the unique hazards and threats to Commerce City.



Why the Need for a Revision

- Rapid growth in the city over the last 15 years.
Population of 45,913 in 2010 to estimated 71,887 in 2025.
- Over the last few years, new city organizational structure which created new departments, divisions, and capabilities.

MSC and Recreation Centers now have Emergency Back-up Generators
Real Time Crime Center (DFR/ALPR/Flock System)

- Updated the Definition Section
 - Disaster Policy Group
 - Emergency Disaster Service Worker Program

- Creation of Operation Plan Annexes
- Added the NIMS Training Requirements
- Identified Line of Succession
- Updated Outside Agencies Section



Next Steps

- Approve the amendment to rescind chapters 23-2 through 23-6 and modify chapter 23-1 of the Commerce City Revised Municipal Code to clarify that the City Manager, or the City Manager's designee, shall create and implement an Emergency Operations Plan for the City.
