I am writing to express my concerns regarding the proposed construction of a new carwash at the intersection of 104th and Revere in Commerce City, CO. This area already has three carwashes in close proximity: Cobblestone Car Wash at 10406 Belle Creek Boulevard, Wash Fox Car Wash at 10480 Chambers Road, and Reunion Car Wash at 18324 E 104th Avenue. Additionally, Grease Monkey at 15410 East 104th Avenue also has car wash bays, further adding to the redundancy.

Moreover, there are 600 homes being built across the street on the south side of 104th Avenue. This significant residential development will increase the demand for essential services and amenities. Currently, we only have one grocery store in the area, and the addition of 600 more families or homes would cause even longer lines and strain on this single grocery store.
