All of Chambers from 104th North to 120th need traffic solutions! Chambers is heavily traveled. Speeds are in excess. For all of the neighborhoods off of Chambers traffic backs up, we cannot safely get out of our neighborhoods at high traffic times, people decide to take the risk and gun it, which makes it unsafe for all that travel on this road as well as the homes closest to Chambers. The signs "do not block intersection" are not obeyed. We need increased patrol enforcement on Chambers at high volume times and tickets issued. We need traffic control and traffic calming measures! We need the city to be proactive! When solutions are found, such as the need for a traffic light to be installed at 117th and Chambers, the wait for the solution is far, far too long! The need has been identified, therefore, at least a temporary switch light or something should be installed until the permanent light can be installed. We need INTERIM measures! We need proactivity! We need safety! We need the city to listen when concerns are brought up continually and we need these issues addressed in a timely manner! Lives are stake here! Adding more housing off of Chambers and in the general area with Chambers being a major thoroughfare must be addressed! PLEASE BE PROACTIVE COMMERCE CITY!!!!
P2 Q6 What does a safe and thriving community look like to you?	Safe at home/safe when outside our homes, ability to participate in local activities.

	When we have issues with water supply and traffic that no one seems to be able to adequately address, why should the city be planning for more housing? We are lacking basic resources in the northern end of the city. Nothing to do around here, not enough basic resources to support the residents. The city should not be focused on how many houses (regardless of high density or single family) can be stuffed into each piece of open land. We need infrastructure now, not when more dense housing is in place. The city can't provide the local residents basic needs now. If we don't have enough water to support more housing, it's an issue! Environmental should not be on the backs of the residents - no fracking near schools and homes! We need better air quality! We need to plan for wildland fires! We don't have a police force that can keep up with significant growth. We need better quality of water. Even though the water department is a separate entity from the city, the city isn't a city without water!

As the city grows, residents should have more chances to work closer to home.

Poor road conditions affect daily quality of life, safety, property pride, and the overall impression people have of our community. I would love to see the city invest in better road maintenance, resurfacing, traffic flow, sidewalks, and long-term infrastructure planning alongside commercial development. New businesses are exciting, but people need safe, well-maintained roads to access them. Growth is exciting, but it needs to improve life for the residents already living here too.
