## Transportation Master Plan Project Update

A Transportation Master Plan (TMP) is a long-term, strategic document that guides how a city will plan for and develop its transportation system to meet future needs and goals. A TMP acts as a blueprint for improving and expanding the network, considering all modes of transportation, including roads, transit, walking, cycling, and more. A TMP also provides a roadmap of prioritized short-term and long-term investments needed to accomplish the goals outlined in the Plan. Commerce City's existing Transportation Master Plan was adopted in 2010, but work on a new and improved plan began in 2024.

As of September 2025, the Draft Transportation Master Plan is available and open for public comment through October 17. The draft plan outlines the community's priorities for safer streets, better transit, expanded walking and biking connections, and improved mobility for all. In addition to safety and multimodal improvements, the draft plan identifies where roadway expansions and new street connections will be needed to manage growth, improve traffic flow, and provide better access across the city. The plan looks at current conditions, future growth forecasts, and community feedback gathered over the past year. This is the fourth and final stage of public engagement for the project.

Once adopted, the new Transportation Master Plan will represent a year and a half long planning process that assessed existing conditions of the transportation network, engaged key stakeholders, and conducted extensive GIS-based analysis of data forecasts to assess the current and future transportation and mobility needs of Commerce City.
