EXHIBIT B

Sec. 12-5005. Solicitations on posted property.

It shall be unlawful for any person to enter or remain upon any public or private property premises in the city for the purpose of soliciting the immediate or future purchase or sale of goods, services, or any other thing of value, or to solicit a gift, a donation, a vote, or any other support or belief when a "No Solicitation" or "No Trespassing" sign is posted at or near the entrance(s) to such premises unless the permission of the owner, agent, representative or occupant of the premises has been previously obtained. This provision shall apply to all solicitations, including, without limitation, those that are charitable, civic, educational, recreational, fraternal, religious, or political in nature. This provision shall not apply to state and local governmental departments, agencies and subdivisions, including public schools; state-accredited private schools and academies; or charitable, civic, patriotic, religious, educational, recreational, fraternal or cultural organizations which are tax exempt pursuant to Section 501(c) of the federal internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended.

All door-to-door solicitors operating within the City of Commerce City shall display a visible, clearly legible identification badge at all times while soliciting. The identification badge shall include, at a minimum, the solicitor's name, the business or organization they represent, and proof of a valid city business license or sales and use tax account.
