### **REQUEST**

Adopt an ordinance amending Chapter 11, Article III, to authorize the impoundment of vehicles stopped by the Police Department where the Officer has probable cause that the operator does not have a valid driver's license, the vehicle is not properly registered, and the vehicle does not have insurance as required by law.

#### **BACKGROUND**

In a study session, on February 24, 2025, City Council expressed a desire for City staff to prepare an ordinance similar to the City of Aurora's ordinance, requiring the Police Department to impound vehicles operating on the roads in Commerce City, when officers have probable cause that the operator does not have a valid driver's license, the vehicle is not properly registered, and the vehicle does not have insurance as required by law.

The City Council's primary focus was on considerations related to public safety and the inherent dangers and risks to the community in allowing a vehicle to be driven on the City's roadways when all three conditions exist. City Council recognized that unlicensed drivers may lack the skills to drive safely and may lack essential knowledge related to traffic laws. Council also acknowledged that unlicensed drivers may have had their license suspended because of too many points or because of driving under the influence or other unsafe driving.

Before proceeding with the introduction of this ordinance, the City needed sufficient resources available to both tow vehicles and to store such vehicles until owners could provide proof that such vehicles are properly registered, insured, and that the operators of such vehicles have valid driver's license. The City now has secured additional towing contracts and is in a position to move forward with the ordinance.
