AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE 2024 BUDGET OF THE CITY OF COMMERCE CITY, COLORADO BY THE RECOGNITION OF THE COLORADO DIVISION OF CRIMINAL JUSTICE GRANT IN THE AMOUNT OF \$100,000 FOR A CORE CITY LIGHTING STUDY

WHEREAS, the Colorado Division of Criminal Justice accepted applications for the Crime Prevention through Safer Streets Grant Program.

WHEREAS, the City of Commerce City (City) applied for \$100,000 for a Core Commerce City Crime Prevention Lighting Study.

WHEREAS, the City was awarded \$100,000 to conduct a street light study to identify the highest priority locations for lighting installation in Core Commerce City, as well as design and develop a street lighting plan to reduce accidents, enhance pedestrian and bicyclist safety, and deter criminal activity.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF COMMERCE CITY, COLORADO, AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. Findings. The recitals to this ordinance are incorporated as findings of the City Council. This ordinance is found to be necessary for the preservation of the public health, safety, and welfare and in the public interest.

SECTION 2. Authorization. An amendment is made to the 2024 Budget of the City of Commerce City, Colorado for the recognition of the funds from the Colorado Division of Criminal Justice in the amount of \$100,000 to be used to conduct a core city lighting study and expenditure thereof is hereby authorized. (Fund 180)

SECTION 3. Repealer. All other ordinances or portions thereof inconsistent or conflicting with this ordinance or any portion hereof are hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistency.

SECTION 4. Effective Date. This ordinance shall be effective immediately upon passage on second and final reading.
